Picturesque Ijen is the site of a labor-intensive sulfur mining operation in which sulfur-laden baskets are hand-carried from the Ijen floor up to the nearby collection point. You will observe how sulfur miners distillate the flowing, smoky material using pipes that are put on the edge of sulfur canals to allow it to frozen. (freeze, as in ice?)

The Ijen Crater is located within the Indonesian Strict Nature Reserve & Tourism Park, at an altitude of 2,386 meters above sea level. The caldera wall forms a prominent ridge measuring roughly just over 200 meters above the waters surface.

The Ijen Crater features a Sub-Alpine forest ecosystem The dominant plants include the Casuarina tree (Casuarina junghuhniana), Jamuju (Podocarpus imbricata), Pasang (Lithocarpus sp), Fanisium (Vacinium varingiaefolia) and the edelweiss flower (Anaphalis javanica), which is an everlasting flower that starts blossoming in August or September.
